
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ETHNOGRAPHY

Ethnography is a qualitative research approach where the intent is to provide detailed, in-depth description of everyday life and practice. Ethnographers generate understanding of culture by providing an 'insider's point of view'. This allows for critical categories and meanings to emerge from the ethnography rather than imposing these from existing models (Brian Hoey, 2014).

The purpose of this presentation is to share my personal experiences of conducting an ethnography as a 'green' prison researcher


The Ethnography

- Medium secure prison PD unit
- 10 months 3 days a week (sometimes 4 days including weekend) – 8 hours a day
- Spaces: clinical staff room, officer staff office, meeting rooms, general communal space

Framework adapted from David Buchanan and colleagues (1988)

- 'Getting in'
- 'Getting on'
- 'Getting out'

'Being in the Way'

• Being 'roleless' in a treatment service 'Who am I?' 'What am I doing?'

• Am I a staff member?

• Just sitting there

'The More Dramatic the Better'

 Pain and frustration is good data

- Invested in everyone's narrative and belonging
